Course Description & Student Learning Outcomes				

Advanced Political Simulation is a course like no other. Throughout this semester, students will assume the roles of key actors in each region of the world. They will then be presented with a historical or current case facing these actors, compelling them to identify and assess a range of possible options in response. To do so effectively, students will be required to learn more about the history of these regions, the important characteristics of various groups and states (e.g. political system, economic models, and cultural values), and the current issues affecting each area. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Explain key moments in history as well as current events taking place in different regions around the world.
- > Identify patterns of effective and ineffective decision making processes and negotiation strategies
- > Analyze how their choices within the simulation paralleled or diverged from their real-world counterparts
- > Create their own theories as to why political leaders in given situations choose to act the way they do.

#### ACTIVE LEARNING FOCUS OF COURSE

The course will focus on providing an atmosphere for active learning. Specifically, it focuses on providing students with the skills they need - as well as content - to obtain a truly global perspective. In this class, the student will play a more active role, take on greater responsibility, and ultimately internalize the role of a policymaker working in a fast-paced, collaborative setting.

#### REQUIRED MATERIALS

There will be no purchased textbook in this course. Instead, students will use eLC for required reading materials as well as announcements, the course calendar, and presentations. They will also use eLC to submit assignments and to take assessments. It essential that students monitor its content regularly.

#### Assignments

- > Small Group Work Sessions (60%): Students will work in small groups throughout the semester. During each simulation, students will have four periods of reflection on the role they are playing, specifically the issues they wish to address and their motivations for doing so. There will also be opportunities throughout the simulations for students to play the role of a journalist that will be reflecting on these posts and replying to them accordingly. Depending on your role for each project (details will be available once groups are formed), your posts to an online discussion board will be completed before 8 a.m Monday, Wednesday, or Friday. No late posts submissions will be accepted, unless documentation covers at least two days prior. As a result, it is strongly advised that you work ahead of the deadlines.
- ➤ Political Leader Projects (30%): In lieu of a midterm or final exam, students will choose two of their favorite political roles that they played during the simulations. For the midterm project, they will present a political leader analysis of the motivations of their role. For the final, they will choose a second role to analyze as well as compare to the-real world actor to determine how the simulation was similar and different to the real political events that unfolded. Late submissions will not be accepted. Thus it is strongly advised to work ahead of all deadlines and ensure your group members submit the video on time.
- ➤ Participation & Attendance (10%): Attendance and active participation while in attendance together count ten percent toward your overall grade. To be counted for attendance, students will need to sign in at the beginning of class each day using a form here: <a href="https://forms.gle/L1g3ikesY8pmJpAq9">https://forms.gle/L1g3ikesY8pmJpAq9</a>. Please come early to ensure enough time for you to sign in and be in your seat before class starts. Students will also use this survey to submit proper documentation if they arrive late (i.e. five minutes after the start of class) or did not attend due to one of the following excuses: 1. University-sanctioned event (proper UGA letterhead will be needed as documentation), 2. Illness (with documentation), and 3. Compelling life event (e.g. religious holiday, wedding or funeral). Once you have submitted an excusal request, the instructor will either approve or decline your request. Only unexcused absences will be counted off of your attendance grade.
