Course Description

Welcome to the MPA program at the University of Georgia! The MPA Socialization Seminar is designed to welcome new students to campus while previewing important themes in public service education. At the end of our three days together, students will be familiar with the five core MPA program competencies, will have a deeper understanding of public service values, and will participate in our commitment to public service during a volunteer day in the Athens community. This one credit hour seminar introduces you to many aspects of life as a graduate student and engages you in discussions about public service values, the role of government in society, and the importance of clear communication as a professional skill in public service.

Student Learning Outcomes & MPA Program Competencies

- Students will demonstrate a familiarity with the five MPA program competencies and understand how they will develop these competencies during their time as MPA students.
- Students will reflect upon their own values in public service and establish a base-line for thinking about how their values inform their public service.
- Students will practice professional writing skills through a collaborative exercise.
- Students will become more familiar with the Athens community by hearing from local leaders and engaging in direct service with a local government or non-profit organization.
