Natural Gas Wallet Share: Ohio

Introduction

NATURAL gas heats homes. It's the fuel behind a hot shower in the morning and a warm kitchen in winter.

Measuring the Burden

This infographic is based on a computed income burden metric, which measures the share of a household's monthly income that goes toward the gas bill, calculated month by month. Natural gas bills are from EIA data on household usage and unit

prices.¹ Household income is from the Bureau of Economic Analysis, adjusted for household size.² Both are converted to 2024 dollars, so a 1997 bill is a fair comparison against one in 2024.³

The Share of the Bill

Picture a household's monthly spending as a single \$100 bill. In Ohio, financial services and insurance take \$24, housing \$20, healthcare \$20, food \$12. Natural gas takes 71 cents. Natural gas represents one of the smallest household expenses, yet delivers outsized value for the home.

The Power of Your Dollar

Ohio, 2024

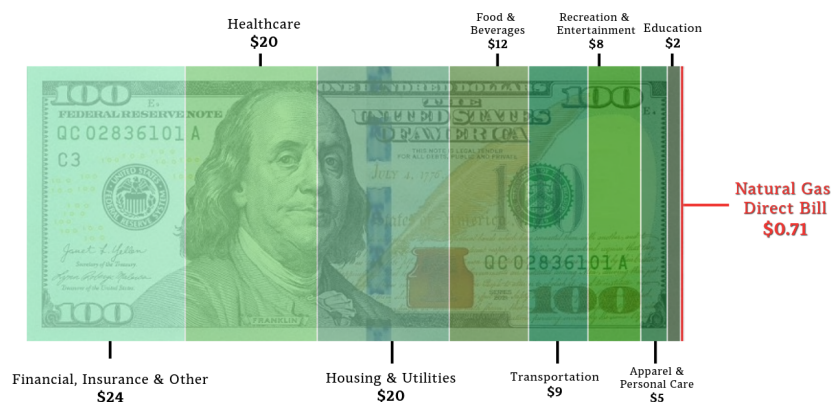


Figure 1: Natural gas as a share of total household spending, Ohio, 2024. Values are rounded to the nearest dollar; natural gas is shown to the cent.⁴
